Current labor supply satisfies 25.6% of peak labor demand.

State offered in \$0 grants and incentives for workforce preparation and development in 2019.

73% of CTE high school graduates are placed in colleges or careers.

Alaska does not recognize NCCER as an approved curriculum for CTE programs.
